

THE CROSS JESUS IN CHINA

is a 4 part documentary composed of testimonies, songs and stories. In the fall of 2003, it was launched simultaneously in the United States and Europe. The documentary video describes the turbulent 50-year history of Chinese Christians in China. Using live footage and interviews, it captures true stories and seeks to answer some of the most common questions, such as the following:

- How did the number of Chinese Christians increase from 700,000 in 1949 to approximately 70 million today, despite communist control?
- How does the Chinese Government deal with Chinese Christians?
- How do Chinese Christians develop, survive and grow?
- What kind of people are they, and what kind of influence have they had and will they have on the Chinese society?

The video consists of three episodes and one short subject. It is approximately four hours long.

- of Chinese missionaries after the Boxer Rebellion. The stories of Mingdao Wang, John Sung, Watchman Nee, Allen Yuan, Samuel Lamb, Moses Xie, Xinfei Yang and Epaphras are all included.
- DISC 2. The Bitter Cup abounds in compelling testimonies by missionaries after the Cultural Revolution. Their dedication, faithfulness and gratitude have led to an unprecedented revival of the Chinese Christian Churches.
- DISC 3. The Spring of Life recounts the real life and the inner world of Christians from a variety of backgrounds, such as farmers, students, officials, criminals, orphans, actors, writers, scientists and entrepreneurs.
- of a farm girl named Xiao Min. She was a junior high school dropout with no musical training. Yet, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, she was able to compose a thousand hymns, which are being sung among Chinese Christian Churches around the world.

THE CROSS JESUS IN CHINA

is a powerful collection of interviews and testimonies, taped on location in China, of Christians from all walks of life, collected across three years. Yuan (Zhiming) brilliantly combines his talents as a filmmaker, philosopher, and apologist as he weaves the dozens of stories into a coherent montage.

His dual-language video series may prove to be one of the most powerful evangelistic tools in contemporary Chinese history.
